

The Islamists deny everything, even evidence

The leaders of Islamist organizations holding mosques and schools in Quebec subsidized denied all the information gathered has our Bureau of Investigation from public documents.

"There is no Muslim school here belonging to the Muslim Association," says Lazhar Aissaoui, director of primary Dar Al-Iman.

Yet, according to the Land Register of Quebec, the building housing the private school owned by the Canadian Muslim Association (CMA) since 2002.

Lazhar Aissaoui ensures that it has nothing to do with this organization "for five or six years."

Yet, according to the Business Register, it is Treasurer of the CMA. Last May, he even signed the purchase of a building of \$ 4.7 million in downtown Montreal, as "executive officer" of the Association.

"I have nothing to tell you"

At the head office in Mississauga, the Islamic Society of North America (ISNA) ensures that the organization no longer controls the Canadian Islamic Trust Foundation (CITF), owner of the buildings housing three mosques and two schools in Quebec.

However, both organizations are living at the same address and their boards are composed of the same people.

The treasurer of the Mosque of Montreal, the official address of the CITF Quebec declined to clarify these gray areas. "I do not comment. I have nothing to say to you," said Hocine Djellab.

Nothing surprising in this reaction, according to a specialist in Islamist Canada Research Chair on Islam, Pluralism and Globalization at the University of Montreal.

According to Wael Saleh, Islamists are regularly accused of practicing "concealment", which is "not to display his deep convictions or not telling the truth when it can get you into trouble."

Sole responsibility of a mosque ISNA who agreed to talk to us, the Secretary General of the Islamic Cultural Association Estrie says unaware of ISNA.

Regragui Youssef explains however that North American mosques often belong to him to prevent local administrators resell places of worship for their benefit. "It's a protection clause."
